

Endoscopic Sinus Surgery

Endoscopic sinus surgery is performed intra-nasally and is recommended only after it has been determined that medical management has been unsuccessful. Surgery, medical management, and failure to intervene all have risks, including as a group, postoperative bleeding, orbital complications (visual impairment), intracranial extension (brain damage or infection), leakage of cerebrospinal fluid, persistent or recurrent nasal obstruction due to failure to manage polyps and recurrent nasal or sinus infections.

Radiographs and endoscopic findings considered in conjunction with the patients' clinical status (following medical evaluation and therapy) would identify the appropriate sinuses to treat.
